Four of the above are Ex 7FTS at Church Fenton namely XN457/23 ex 34/7FTS, XN472/24 ex 29/7FTS, XR662/48 ex 11/7FTS, XP617/37 ex 11/7FTS the latter was reported erroneously in this journal as having gone to 2FTS. The editor also queries XN491/15 which serial does not fit into known J.P. batches. As 7FTS at Church Fenton is now known to be running down in the next 2/3 months it might be expected that 7FTS Jet Provosts will appear with 1FTS at Linton and 3FTS at Leeming.

BINGLEY On the premises of a scrap dealer, Auto Spares(Bingley) Ltd. are the remains of ten Vampire NF10's which were bought at Shrewsbury with ten others in 1963. Serials known are VM707, VM712, VM730/W, WP242, WP255/T and two others coded C and L (Ex. - VM707 is very unusual in that it is reported as having been exported to the Indian AF as ID1611). This scrapheap was a very large one in the mid fifties and many aircraft ended up here - particularly Meteors. We would point out that this heap is not in the town of Bingley but on the moors nearby. RAF CHURCH FENTON - HISTORY

Mr. R.D.Allison has contributed much additional information to that given in last months issue. He has at the same time added some details of a little known subject - Hornets in Yorkshire.

No.19 Squadron:- Based here 1947 with Hornet F1, including PX226 QV-A, PX278 QV-E, PX284 QV-H, PX233 QV-K. Re-equipped with Hornet F3 including PX389 QV-A, PX346 QV-C, PX342 QV-E, PX367 QV-J. Re-equipped with Meteor F8 1951 (some being WA758, WA870, WE963) and re-equipped again in 1957 with Hunter F6, including XE603/R, XE583/D, XG172/B, XF527/P. Moved to Leconfield 1959.

No.41 Squadron:- Based here 1947 with Hornet F1, including PX232, PX244, PX252, also re-equipped with Hornet F3 including PX363 EB-B, PX294 EB-E, PX300 EB-Y. Re-equipped with Meteor F4 in 1951 and moved to Biggin Hill.

No.64 Squadron:- Here in 1947 with Hornet F1 (including PX279 SH-A, PX285 SH-E, PX248 SH-R). Re-equipped with Hornet F3 and moved to Linton-on-Ouse.

No.72 Squadron:- Moved here from North Weald 1953 with Meteor F8, these being replaced with NF12 and NF14 in 1956 (including WS607/A, WS611/N, WS697/T, WS591/F, WS833/G, WS845/R). Re-equipped with Javelin F(AW)4 and moved to Leconfield in 1959.

No.85 Squadron:- Moved here from West Malling with Meteor NF12 and NF14 including WS608/D, WS593/X, WS777/O, WS743/M, WS781/L, WS775/N. Squadron disbanded 1958.

No.257 Squadron:- Re-formed here 1947 with Meteor F3 including EE272, EE292, EE352. Moved to Horsham St.Faith 1947.

No.263 Squadron:- Moved here from Acklington 1945 and moved to Horsham with No.257 Sqn. in 1947. Equipped with Meteor F3 including EE271, EE277, EE300.

BUCCANEER BITS:- A new unit at Lossiemouth is No.763B Sqn. with the Mk.S2 model (eg XT275 LM650, XT285 LM653). XT285 is in the new colour scheme for front-line Navy a/c - dark sea grey overall. The first Buccaneer S2 Sqn. to go to sea is No.801 which embarked on H.M.S. Victorious on 14/5 in the Moray Firth with a complement of nine a/c. XV155 was d/d to Lossiemouth 26/5 and XV159 was d/d to Helms on 22/6. The PM will not allow a replacement Buccaneer to be built for the SAAF in place of the one that crashed on delivery. Another Bucc-
